We entered into this to support DIF&W's goals to improve the harvest of salmon in this body of water, specifically to address "poor salmon growth and condition." The structure of the derby is focused on removing smaller fish with minimal impact to other species such as trout.

After a couple of very challenging years due to Covid, our very loyal membership has remained solid. Membership dues, the lifeblood of our organization has remained sound. Thank you everyone!

With help from our very generous sponsors, we were able to add a "Kids' Fishing Derby" this year. This event was a tremendous success. Hopefully our supporters will help us continue this event next summer and into the future.

Our organization is committed to investing in events and programs that benefit the community. The "Kids' Derby", in addition to our outstanding Junior Guides program, are just a couple of examples. We can only do this with financial support. Thank you sponsors!

The July 3rd in the Park was a fundraising success thanks to our investment in additional equipment. We sold a lot of "Guide Fries"! The Strawberry Festival, due to the terrible weather, had a much lower volume but still produced a positive fund-raising result. Thank you to all the volunteers!

We maintain a separate insurance program for the rifle and pistol range. In order to maintain pricing stability and keep this popular venue available for all our membership at a nominal cost, we implemented a more rigorous risk management process a year ago. Risk transfer agreements are now signed by all users every calendar year. This effort has allowed us to more accurately determine usage, and provide assurance to our underwriter that we are a sound risk. All of which has helped us maintain insurance premiums at a reasonable level. A special thanks to one of our members who gave our organization a very generous gift to help us defray the cost of this insurance.

Overall, we will finish the calendar year on the positive side. Our balance sheet remains sound. We are well positioned to continue our mission of promoting Rangeley's outdoor sporting activities.

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL

We had another strong year of membership. We were slightly less than our record post-Covid year, but still very strong. We will finish 2022 with around 1050 members. Our membership drive is also the largest source of funds for our scholarship programs. This year, we received more than \$2200 while granting \$2500. Thanks to all those who help support our scholarship program.

For 2023, expect to receive an email invitation to renew in late January and a paper renewal form in late February. Our membership year runs from January 1 through December 31. As a reminder, you can always point prospective members to the membership tab on our website where they can either print out an application or complete the process online. You can also direct them to River's Edge Sport Shop where they are always happy to take a membership in-person.

We expect our membership rates to increase slightly for 2023, \$5 more for individual and family memberships. It's been a very long time since these changed. We'd like to allocate the increase to make some accessibility changes to our clubhouse as well as some improvements to our shooting range.
